- "Sew Trendy" fashions and accessories. A 28-page project book that uses fat quarters.
- "The Dolls' Dressmaker," The Complete Pattern Book by Venus A. Dodge (with many tracible patterns!)
- Dress form for an 18-inch doll.
- Metal fitting form for making clothes for 18" doll.
- Clothes hanger rack for all size doll clothes.
- Packages of embellishments for doll clothes.
- Lace and ribbon snippets perfect for doll items.
- Assorted DMC threads.
- Fabrics, some fat quarters, some yardage, all suitable for "little clothes"
- Omni grid tote size foldaway. Perfect for cutting and pressing that folds up to 8" X11"!
- 8" X 10" Magnetic Board with ruler. Keeps your smocking plates or charts where you want them.
