

This is our final drawing for the 2022-2023 Co-Builder. We have had positive feedback this year and hope to continue for another year. Our final items are perfect for travel or storage—an encore of pre-Covid drawings. This time they are a blue designed fabric --- Yes, a coordinating set of bags (plus a bonus).

- A large, duffle bag size tote (11<sup>"</sup> X 20" X 9") that fits a travel sewing machine or ½ dozen projects! Zipper closure.
- A medium size tote- shopping bag size— (12" X 15") 6 inside small pockets, zipper closure. Great size for a single project.
- A small purse tote (closed size 7" X 4") 2 zipper sections with 9 small pockets perfect for needle packets and 4 pockets for small tools.
  - the other side has 2 sections separated by a zippered pouch. You can even slip your smart phone inside!
- Do you machine embroider, fabric paint, or stencil? Well -- a Canvas, zipper top (blue trim) and front zipper pocket, tote is the bonus. Decorate it or leave it plain. Your choice!
